6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- PG Departments are engaged in syllabus formulation.
- The UG department do not have any scope for curriculum development, except some faculty members who are in the Board of Studies in the University. UG departments solely depend on the parent University for their curriculum.
- Some departments have projects, internal assessments, MCQs in the evaluation process.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- ICT included in regular teaching in some departments, like Geography, Electronics, English, Commerce etc.
- 2 Monographs were published by the Dept. of Geography comprising of 24 dissertations by Post Graduate students.
- "Sambad Bhairab" is annually published by the Dept. of Journalism containing articles, interviews and analysis on current affairs undertaken by students and some faculty members.
- Post-conference proceedings of the National Seminars was published by the Department of Bengali.
- Publication of books by Faculty members of Urdu and Bengali departments.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- 1. Semester system adopted in the PG departments.
- 2. For UG Departments: Examination and form of evaluation are decided by the parent University.
- 3. College conducts Mid-Term and Selection Examination, scripts are shown to students after examining.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Institutional support is always extend to the faculty members for pursuing research. Study Leaves are permitted for faculty members who are engaged in research.

Duty Leaves are permitted for presenting papers in seminars and conferences.

Teachers are motivated to publish articles in high ranking journals and present papers in seminars and conferences.

The students are also encouraged to participate in conference for poster and paper presentation. The institution comes up with all sorts of academic and logistic help to the research fraternity.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- New class rooms have been constructed.
- ICT facility is regularly utilised in the P.G. departments and by the faculties of Science and Commerce in particular.
- 198 books were purchased in the library. A resolution was adopted to purchase new versatile and user-friendly software KOHA.
- Vacuum cleaner was purchased for use in the Library.
- Regular pest control for the Library is taken up.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- 1. Special classes are organized for preparation of students for competitive examination like School Service Commission.
- 2. Committees, like students welfare Committee, Grievance Redressal Cell, Cell for Gender Sensitization try to improve the overall environment of the College.
- 3. Students' Union play significant role through Student Welfare, Games & Sports and Cultural Committees.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

West Bengal College Service Commission (CSC) appoints the faculty members in substantive post. But there is scarcity in faculty members. In 2011-12, CSC has not recruited any candidate. The College with a positive academic outlook identifies the need for contractual faculty recruitment and appoints guest faculty for the benefit of the students.
